Directions To Campus

Atlanta is the meeting point for three major interstate highways. Follow these directions to get to Georgia State University from almost anywhere. These directions will take you to M Deck at the corner of Gilmer Street and Piedmont Road. The Student Center is on the corner of Gilmer and Piedmont. You also may want to check out the campus map

From I-75/85 Northbound

Exit #246 (Central Avenue/Fulton Street). Follow the signs to Fulton Street. At the light at the end of the ramp, turn right onto Fulton. At the next light, turn left on Capitol Avenue. After crossing MLK Jr. Drive, Capitol Avenue becomes Piedmont Avenue and passes through campus. Proceed past Gilmer Street (M Deck will be on your left) to Auditorium Place. Take a left and look for the M Deck entrance. Once you park exit via the M Deck Pedestrian Entrance which will be directly across from the Student Center.

For School Buses and over-sized vehicles: From Piedmont Avenue, turn left on Decatur Street and right or left on Collins Street.

From I-75/85 Northbound H.O.V. Lane

Exit at Memorial Drive. At the first light, go straight and you will be on Central Avenue, which leads to the campus. Central Avenue becomes Peachtree Center Avenue once you cross Decatur Street. Go to the next right and turn onto Gilmer Street (Hurt Park will be on your left) and proceed across Courtland to Piedmont Road. Take a left (M Deck will be on your left) and then another left at Auditorium Place. Look for the M Deck Entrance. Once you park exit via the M Deck Pedestrian Entrance which will be directly across from the Student Center.

For School Buses and Over-sized vehicles: When you are on Central Avenue, Turn right on Decatur Street and make a right or left on Collins Street.

From I-75/85 Southbound

Exit #249A (Courtland Street/Georgia State University) is a one-way street that leads to the campus. Move to the extreme left hand lane once you cross Edgewood Avenue and take an immediate left at Auditorium Place. Proceed towards Piedmont Road. Look for the M Deck entrance on your right. Once you park exit via the M Deck Pedestrian Entrance which will be directly across from the Student Center.

For School Buses and Over-sized vehicles: Turn left on Gilmer Street from Courtland Street and proceed to Jessie Hill Jr. Drive. Turn Right on Jessie Hill Jr. Drive and then make another right on Decatur Street. Make a right or left on Collins Street.

From I-20 Eastbound

Exit #56B (Windsor/Spring Street), go straight to the third traffic light. Take a left on Central Avenue, which leads to the campus. Central Avenue becomes Peachtree Center Avenue once you cross Decatur Street. Go to the next right and turn onto Gilmer Street (Hurt Park will be on your left) and proceed across Courtland to Piedmont Road. Take a left (M Deck will be on your left) and then another left at Auditorium Place. Look for the M Deck entrance. Once you park exit via the M Deck Pedestrian Entrance which will be directly across from the Student Center.

For School Buses and Over-sized vehicles: When you are on Central Avenue, Turn right on Decatur Street and make a right or left on Collins Street.

From I-20 Westbound

Exit #58A (Capitol Avenue) and turn right at the light. Stay on Capitol Avenue, which changes into Piedmont Avenue and leads to the campus. Proceed past Gilmer Street (M Deck will be on your left) to Auditorium Place. Take a left and look for the M Deck entrance. Once you park exit via the M Deck Pedestrian Entrance which will be directly across from the Student Center.

For School Buses and over-sized vehicles: From Piedmont Ave, turn left on Decatur Street and right or left on Collins Street.

MARTA

Take the East/West Rapid Rail line to the Georgia State Station (E1). Exit the station onto Piedmont Avenue and proceed north (in the direction of the traffic) two blocks to Gilmer Street. The student Center will be on the corner of Gilmer and Piedmont.

Rules and Regulations

- The competition will start promptly at 9:00AM. No team will be allowed to join the competition once it has started.
- There are 10 rounds of 10 questions each.
- All the questions are multiple choices and true/false questions.
- If your school has more than one team make sure that your team is correctly identified on all answer sheets. Schools with two teams have been identified as either "School Name" A or B
- Mark your team's answer on the answer sheet using only the first column (numbers "1-10"). Scantron bubbles must be filled in completely in order to receive a score for your answers.
- Once the moderator has read the question and answer options out loud you will have 30 seconds to discuss and mark your answer.
- Judges will collect answer sheets after each round.
- After each round the Moderator will display by PowerPoint the correct answers for that round.
- Team standings will be announced and displayed by PowerPoint after Intermission and again after the winners have been announced at the award ceremony.
- A team consists of four (4) players. Player substitutions are not allowed during the competition.
- Teams are not allowed to consult with coaches, the audience, wireless devices, cell phones, other teams, books or other written material during rounds. Any team found by 2008 Metro Atlanta Academic WorldQuest moderators, judges, runners, or staff to be violating this rule will forfeit that round.
- If a team believes another team is cheating, the accusation has to be brought to the attention of a 2008 Metro Atlanta Academic WorldQuest representative immediately. If the challenged team is not found to be in violation of any rules, the accusing team will forfeit five (5) points.
- Challenges can be lodged at the end of rounds 5 and 10. If your team wishes to challenge an answer, only the team captain may bring the challenge calmly and politely to a judge. The decision of the head judge is final. If your challenge is unsuccessful, your team will forfeit ten (10) points.
- Scoring
- 1 point for each right answer.
- No penalty for wrong answers or answers left blank.
- In the event two or more teams are tied, there will be tie breaker rounds consisting of five questions each at the end of the main competition. The tie-breaker rounds will continue until there are clear 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place teams. \
