In furtherance of mutual goals to foster internationalization of education, officials from the above-named institutions hereby express their intent to collaborate.

Based upon discussions held during a visit by President [redacted] during a visit by President Çağrı Erhan on March 17, 2016, the two universities have identified the following areas of common educational interests including recruitment of Altınbaş University (formerly Istanbul Kemerburgaz University) law students to Georgia State's LLM Program and its Summer Institute. Other possible areas are: exchange and visits by students and faculty (pursuant to existing Travel Warning policies at either or both universities), exchange of information, joint conferences and academic programs, and joint research activities and publications.

Specific details for implementing the above collaborations will be developed mutually and reflected in follow-on agreements to be negotiated and signed by authorized individuals from each institution.

This letter shall not constitute a binding agreement and is expressly contingent upon execution of a Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) and/or a Program Specific Agreement (PSA) by and between the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia by and on behalf of Georgia State University and Altınbaş University (formerly Istanbul Kemerburgaz University).

Specific details for implementing the above collaborations will be developed mutually and reflected in follow-on agreements to be negotiated and signed by authorized individuals from each institution.


